# Beyond Advanced Studies: Interdisciplinary Theory and Research (areers

The first workhop within the Beyond Advanced Studies initiative.

### 8 - 10 November 2021

To respond to complex societal challenges, a mobilization of interdisciplinary research is urgently needed. This is the purpose of a series of three exploratory workshops, *Beyond Advanced Studies*, to be held at the Aarhus Institute of Advanced Studies (AIAS), the Swedish Collegium for Advanced Study (SCAS), and the Turku Institute for Advanced Studies (TIAS). Building on the particular strengths of Nordic research and on the unique experience and expertise of Institutes for Advanced Study (IAS) in the Nordic countries, the workshop series aims to provide a platform for sharing experiences of interdisciplinary research, models for organizing research, and the role of IASs in these efforts.

"What is interdisciplinarity?"; "How does it exist in today's academia?"; and "How can one build a career in interdisciplinary research?" will be the subject of the first workshop. At present, interdisciplinary research is a poorly defined concept, hindered by a number of barriers. For example, for early-career scholars, publications from interdisciplinary work may not carry the same rewards as discipline-based publications. Furthermore, a clear model of career progression is usually not available, other than to return to single-discipline roles with added responsibilities in teaching and administration. Interdisciplinary research may, on the other hand, also open up new research trajectories. At this workshop, existing conceptions of interdisciplinary research will be explored and challenged.

The initiative is funded by the Joint Committee for Nordic Research Councils in the Humanities and Social Sciences (NOS-HS).

The first workshop will be held at the Swedish Collegium for Advanced Study in Uppsala. Digital participation in the workshop will be possible.
