

Deep Talk is a method for developing joined language and understanding with narrative-based group activities. The aim is to visualize individual's values, attitudes, ethics and enable to participants to express and share their inner thoughts. The method is created by Tuula Valkonen.

At the heart of the method are narratives or stories whose origins and authors vary and which have a strong symbolic level. The name, Deep Talk, refers to the inner speech that the method seeks to bring to surface through certain steps and repetitive elements.

The Deep Talk method always starts with the participants calming down by sitting down in a circle and opening a bag of sand. As all the participants are ready to listen, the narrator start telling the story. He simultaneously enlivens the story with patterns drawn on the sand and the sounds created by moving the sand. In the method, sand is a desert where anything is possible. After the story, participants share their thoughts: what was best in the story, where in the story they would like to be and was there something they would like to change in the story. There is no right or wrong answers.

After the discussion, there is a change in rhythm, which is illustrated by changing places in the circle. At next phase, the meaning of the story is pondered in the lives of the community and the participants: The narrator draws to the sand the moods, hopes and fears of the participants and asks questions of their values. After that, each participant describes their thoughts by selecting a wooden character and placing in the sandy landscape.

Finally, it is time for a common celebration and a task of wonder to implement at home.

Deep Talk: Tuula Valkonen

# 1. ARE YOU READY TO HEAR THE STORY?



Sit down and make a circuit on the floor or at a table.

Pay attention to every child.

Calm down, take a deep breath and ask:
Are you ready to hear the story?

Start the story when you are ready and let the story come.

# STORY AND WONDERING

Press your gaze down.
 Tell the story peacefully in a calm atmosphere.
 Illustrate the story with hand movements and sounds of the sand.

### Questions of wonder:

Ask the following questions after the story:

- -What did you like most in the story?
- -What part of the story would you like to take away/
- -What part of the story you did not like?
- -Where in the story would you like to be today?

After presenting the question, stand up and change places In the circle if possible. (If the group cannot change places, the narrator should change her/his place).

Create the day of the group by molding the sand

What kind of things you would like to put on the sand Today? (Joys, sorrows, tensions, hurries, wishes, concrete things, feelings and thoughts). Remember and remind that you do not have to say everything aloud.

Ask the story question (each story has its own question)
Collect children's answers to the symbol (diamond, donkey, cloak)
But do not show the symbol immediately to children.

Provide a small delight for everyone and serve the delight to everyone in a festive manner.

Start the celebration simultaneously: start enjoying the delight at the same time.

A mental exercise (reflection task) to take home: depends on the story (f.e. think 1-3 topics of gratitude in the evening at home)





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
