


Why do we need general expectations for the TIS community?

- · We want to keep everyone safe.
- · We want to teach TIS students to be valuable members of any community.
- · We want clarity to what is expected of everyone in the TIS community, students and adults alike.

How do we make these expectations a reality in our community?

- Everyone learns the expectations at the beginning of the school year.
 We remind each other about the expectations whenever needed.
- · We know what happens if we don't follow the expectations.
- · After the move, we review the expectations and modify them to serve the needs of the new building.

GENERAL EXPECTATIONS



- Respect everyone's physical integrity.
 Do not touch anyone in any way they might find harmful.
 If you touch someone without their permission, it is up to them to define if it was harmful to them or not.
- Always act and speak in a respectful manner.
 - · Interact with all students and adults in a way that shows respect.
 - o It is up to the other person to define if your actions or words were disrespectful.
 - · No swearing or using other disrespectful language.
- Stay inside the school area the entire school day.
- Keep your phone in your bag or locker the entire school day.
 Do not keep your phone in your pocket during any part of your school day.
 Only use your phone if you are specifically told to by a teacher.

CORRIDORS AND STAIRS

- Be quiet in the corridors and staircases.

 Quiet means no talking. If you absolutely need to talk, then whisper.
- Move swiftly and calmly to and from your classroom.
 No running. Be especially careful on the staircases.
 No hanging around in the hallway.
- Take others into consideration.
 - · Only move in a way that you see what is in front of you to avoid bumping into people.
 - · Move out of the way when others are passing through.
 - · Leave space for others.
- Walk on the right side of the corridor or staircase.
 Let's practice right-hand traffic in all spaces!



CORRIDORS AND STAIRS

• Take responsibility for your own belongings and leave other people's things alone.

• Handle other people's things only when necessary and with care, e.g. when looking for your coat, make sure you don't drop other people's things on the ground.

· Lable your belongings.

· Note that everything you bring from home is your own responsibility.


Keep the hallways tidy.

· Wipe your feet when coming in.

· Hang up clothes and bags, leave shoes neatly by the wall or on a rack.

· Put all trash in the bins, even if it's not yours.

· Don't leave things in the middle of the hallway even for a bit.



• Hold recess equipment (balls etc.) in your hand until you are outside.

• No bouncing or throwing balls or using other equipment until you are in the recess area dedicated to the game.

CORRIDORS AND STAIRS

Hold doors open for others.
 We practice the politeness of holding the door for the person walking behind you until they can reach it themselves.

Be where your teacher has asked you to be.
 Meaning if you're asked to line up or sit at a table in the hallway then that is the only place you can be, not walking around.

• Give other groups the privacy and peace to learn.

• Don't peek into other classrooms or try to get other students' attention even if you are in the hallway during their lesson.



JLASSROC

- Remove outdoor clothing and leave them neatly in the designated area.

 Outdoor clothing includes gloves, hats, coats and outdoor pants.
- Be on time.
- Enter the classroom quietly.
- Come prepared with the necessary study materials and completed homework.

 Study materials include books, notebooks, handouts, pencils, erasers, sharpeners and learning devices as well as any other equipment you might need during your lessons.
 - · Devices (iPad or laptop) need to be charged and ready to use.
- Use the bathroom before or after class to avoid disruptions.
- Do not bring food into the classroom unless you are told to do so. Do not chew gum.



ILASSROO

- Listen actively to the speaker and follow instructions the first time they are given.
 - · Active listening means sitting up straight, hands in your lap and eyes on the speaker.
- Raise your hand and wait for permission to speak.
- Work quietly.
 - · No talking, raise your hand if you need help, stay in your seat unless told otherwise.
- Only use your iPad or laptop when you are specifically told to do so.
 Otherwise keep them in your desk or backpack.
- Complete your tasks on time.



CLASSROO

- Use respectful language.
- Work respectfully with all classmates and be willing to collaborate.

 No commenting negatively about who you're told to work with.




- Respect everyone's learning time.
 Don't disturb others with questions or anything else. Don't use lesson time on things that don't concern the topic at hand.
- Keep the classroom tidy and organized.
 Clean up after yourself and help others keep the classroom organised.
- Respect shared equipment.
 - · Use all shared equipment properly and carefully.
 - · Return all shared equipment exactly where it belongs.



LUNCHHALL

- Walk slowly.
- · Wear shoes but no outdoor clothing.
- Try a spoonfull of each type of food.
- Use a knife and a fork.
- Chew with your mouth closed and only talk with an empty mouth.
- Speak in a hushed voice and only with the people right next to you.
- Keep your food on your own plate and tray.
- Eat your own food without playing around with it.
- Only say nice things about the food.
- Finish all the food you have taken.




WHEN YOU'RE DONE

- Clean up after yourself.
- Return your tray.
- Say thank you to the lunch staff.
- Head out to recess as soon as you can.

LIBRARY

• Ask the teacher's permission to go to the library.

- Respect other's right to visit the library.
- Walk quietly.
- Use your whisper voice.
- Never bring food into the library.
- Borrow the books before taking them out.
- Keep the books and your library card safe.
- Take good care of the library books at school and at home.



WHEN YOU'RE DONE


- Return books on time.
- Place the books in their correct place.

- One person in a toilet at a time.
- Only use the toilets when you actually need to. They are not for spending recess in.
- Preferably use the toilet before or after the lessons.
 - · If you really need to go to the bathroom during a lesson, wait for a good time and ask for permission.
- Respect everyone's privacy while they use the bathroom.
 - · Don't knock on the doors or flick the handles while someone is in the toilet.
- Wash your hands with soap and dry them carefully.
 Use an appropriate amount of paper.
- Leave the toilets tidy.
 Flush the toilet.

 - · Put hand towels in the trash.
 - · Close the door behind you.

CHANGING ROOMS

- Enter only during assigned times with your teacher.
- Walk at all times no running or rough play.
- Give others privacy and personal space.
- Speak quietly and respectfully.
- Change quickly into your P.E. clothes. Take off watches and jewellery.
- Keep your belongings organized in your own space. Never leave your clothes on the floor.
- Wash up and change into clean clothes after the P.E. lesson.
- Be ready to leave the changing room on time with all of your belongings.
- Leave shower and bathroom spaces tidy.



GYMASIUM

- Enter only with teacher's permission.
 Be ready to come in when you are told to.
 Wait quietly for instructions.
- Wear appropriate clothing.
 Gym clothing includes clothes that allow you to move freely.
 Jeans or outdoor clothing are not appropriate for gym.
- Listen carefully and quietly to the teacher's instructions.
- Take others into account when moving around in the gym.
- Play safely and fairly.
 Play by the rules and instructions.
 Make sure you don't put yourself or others in harm's way.
 Admit to your or your team's mistakes and give credit to others.



GYMASIUM

- Ask the teacher for permission to use the equipment.
- Use the correct equipment according to the instructions.

• Take care of the equipment.

• Handle the equipment in an appropriate way to make sure they

are useful for as long as possible.


Don't leave the equipment lying around where someone might step on or break them.

· Bring all equipment back to where they belong.

AFTER THE LESSON

- Help clean up.
- Take your belongings.
- Wash and dry all areas of your body that got sweaty during the lesson.
 At least wash your hands and feet.

 - · Don't wash your hair.



RECESS YARD

- Stay in the recess area.
- Take into account your own and others' safety when playing.
 Think about the space you are playing in: is the game safe to play in that space, are you or others in harm's way when you play, and what could happen if someone falls down.
 - · Do not throw snow, rocks or sand.
- Play by the rules and wait for your turn to play.
- Handle recess equipment with care.
- · Make sure your phone is not out in the recess area, even after your school day.
- Get help from the nearest adult when needed.

WE ARE A KIVA SCHOOL!

- Make sure no one is left alone or bullied.
 - o If you see someone spending time alone, you can ask them if they want to join in or do they prefer to be alone.
 - o If you see anyone being bullied or hurt in any way, step in or get an adult to help.
 - · Let everyone join in recess play.



RECESS YARD

WHEN THE BELL RINGS

- Stop all games right away.
- Take all equipment with you.
- Leave the recess area tidy.
 Pick up all recess equipment and any trash you see.
 Put things back to where you took them from.
- Quickly head to the door.
- Line up quietly at the door.
